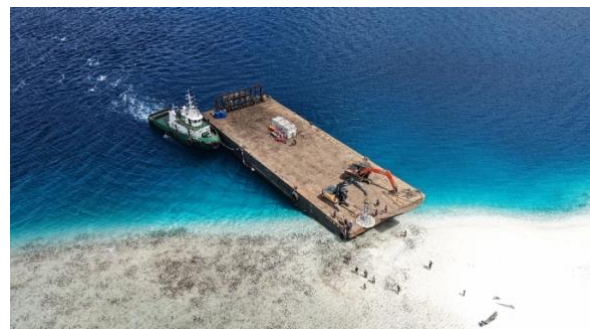


THE SOLOMON SIREN IS IN HER RESTING PLACE ON THE SEA FLOOR!

RESULT!: we are really delighted to see the Siren installed on the seabed where Kale Island once stood proudly above the tides.



Our specific funds will be used to pay for the barge that has taken the Siren on the third and final leg of her journey, starting in a container ship from Folkstone to Honiara, capital of SI, approximately 8 weeks and 8 thousand nautical miles away!
